### Proposal

The applicant has submitted a Zoning By-law Amendment application to facilitate the redevelopment of the site with a 12-storey mixed-use building measuring 49 metres in height (52 metres including the mechanical penthouse) containing retail uses at grade and on level 2, office uses on levels 3-7 and 77 residential units on levels 8-12. A total of 125 parking spaces and 163 bike parking spaces are proposed in a below grade parking garage. 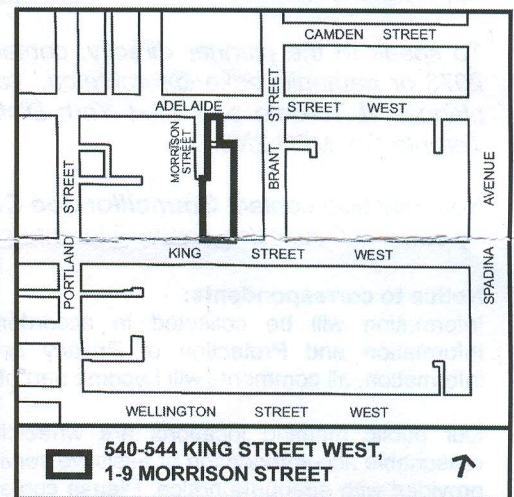
